

JUNIOR RODEO EVENTS AND RULES 2024

Registration begins the first week of June.

There is no entry fee for the Jr. Rodeo
Admission onto the rodeo grounds will apply.

Pee Wee Barrel Racing (Certificate and Rosette awarded each night, Trophy awarded to the fastest time of the weekend)

- Age Group: 9 & Under.
- Children must provide their own Helmet & Horse.
- Contestants will run a standard barrel pattern.
- The pattern must be done at a **SAFE SPEED**.
- Parents may lead the horse if needed.
- Meet at the South end of the arena at 5:45pm (2:15 1st July perf) with your horse.
- The winner will be based on time and pattern completed correctly (in the spirit of the event).

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: 10 PER PERFORMANCE
PRE-REGISTRATION REQUIRED

Junior Barrel Racing (Certificate and Rosette awarded each night, Trophy awarded to the fastest time of the weekend)

- Age Group: 10-14
- Children must provide their own Helmet & Horse
- Contestants will run a standard barrel pattern.
- Pattern must be done at a **SAFE SPEED**
- Meet at the South end of the arena at 5:45pm (2:15 1st July perf) with your horse.
- The winner will be based on time and pattern completed correctly.

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: 10 PER PERFORMANCE
PRE-REGISTRATION REQUIRED

****Horses are not provided for the Barrel Racing events. Contestants must make arrangements for their own horse. ****

*****All Horses and Horse Trailers must be parked outside the gate at the south end of the arena *****

Mutton Busting (T-Shirt awarded to each contestant)

- Age Group: 5 & 6 (NO EXCEPTIONS)
- Children must provide their own helmet (minimum requirement).
- Meet at the North end of the arena at 5:45 pm (2.15 pm 1st July)

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: 10 PER PERFORMANCE

JUNIOR RODEO EVENTS AND RULES

Sheep Scramble (Prize awarded to winner)

- Age Group: 7 & Under
- Meet at north end of the arena at 6:15 pm (2:45 pm 1st July)
- A horn will sound marking “GO”
- The object is to pull the ribbon off the sheep and run the ribbon back to the designated person in front of the bucking chutes. First person to bring the ribbon back is the Winner.

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: Unlimited
PRE-REGISTRATION NOT REQUIRED

Calf Scramble (Prize awarded to winner)

- Age Group: 8 to 12
- Meet at north end of the arena at 6:15 pm (2:45 pm 1st July)
- A horn will sound marking “GO”
- The object is to pull the ribbon off the calf and run the ribbon back to the designated person in front of the bucking chutes. First person to bring the ribbon back is the Winner.

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: Unlimited
PRE-REGISTRATION NOT REQUIRED

Wild Pony Race (Gift Cards are awarded to fastest team of the night)

- Age Group: 8 – 13
- 3-person team
- One entry per person and/or team per day. Additional days entries subject to availability.
- Each team must provide their own helmets, flak jackets and gloves.
- Meet at the north end of the arena at intermission.
- There will be a maximum of 8 teams competing each night with gift cards awarded to the winning team each night.
- All team members hold the lead shank while chute is opened, the pony must then first cross the chalk line, one team member continues to hold the lead shank while another holds the pony's head, while the 3rd then jumps on the pony's back and stays on as long as possible. Minimum of 2 jumps for ride to count.

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: 8 Teams (of 3) per performance
PRE-REGISTRATION REQUIRED

JUNIOR RODEO EVENTS AND RULES

All contestants must sign in on arrival at the grounds

- All children should wear long sleeve shirts, pants and closed toe shoes (no sandals or flip flops) to avoid injury
- All contestants in every event will be required to have a Parent or Guardian over the age of 18 sign a Waiver for all events that they are entered in.
- Proof of age of contestant may be required when signing in (Alberta Health Care Card or Birth Certificate)
- All contestants must be signed in by 5:30 pm if not your spot can and will be given to someone else.
- Arena Manager reserves the right to disallow a contestant to compete.

Code of Conduct for all Contestants

The Airdrie Rodeo Ranch Association reserve the right to refuse an individual and/or parents participations in any Jr.Rodeo event, if the individual and /or parent's character and behavior does not comply with the Safety Rules and/or Code Of Conduct:
